Title: The Call of Matthew

Introduction:

- Matthew 9:9-13
- What do we know about Matthew?
- We can all identify with Matthew's calling.
- Romans 5:8 While we were yet sinners...

1. Call of Grace (v. 9)

- What qualified Matthew to be called by Jesus?
- He saves, not because we are rich or righteous, but because we are sinners in need of a Savior.

2. Obedience of Faith (v. 9)

• Why do you think Matthew followed right away. Scripture does not give us any clue regarding questions, concerns, or doubts. Just obedience.

3. **Proof of Love (v. 10)**

Jesus sits with the tax-collectors and sinners.

4. Place of Hope (v. 10)

- Many came to Jesus.
- The presence of Jesus gives hope, peace, strength, and comfort.

5. Manifestation of Pride (v. 11)

- Why did the Pharisees ask the disciples and not Jesus?
- Pride blinds the eyes from seeing the great depths of divine grace.

6. Condition of Need (v. 12)

- Until a person recognizes his/her sinful condition, it will be hard to surrender to Jesus.
- The Pharisees were not "sin-sick" they were "self-satisfied."

7. Purpose of Christ (v. 13)

 Christ comes so that we might be saved. When we realize we are lost, it is easy (like Matthew), to arise and follow Christ.
