Care Group 2024 Session 6: A Pattern of Mercy



Scripture Review: 2 Corinthians 2:15 - ¹⁵ For we are to God the *fragrance* of Christ among those who are being saved and among those who are perishing.

Launch — If we are going to be the fragrance of Christ to God, we must pattern our lives after Jesus when it comes to mercy and forgiveness. When do you find it most difficult to forgive?

God loves us unconditionally, God forgives us unconditionally, however, the way we often experience God's love and forgiveness is linked to way we ourselves love and forgive!

- **Read Matthew 6:10-13** Pay close attention to verse 12. Jesus is implying that you will be forgiven in the same way you forgive, "Forgive us **our** debts, **as we** forgive our debtors."
- This same concept is expressed in **Luke 6:38,** "...for with the same measure that you use, it will be measured back to you."

God does not "withhold" His love, grace, mercy and forgiveness, in fact when Peter asked Jesus how many times we should forgive in Matthew 18:21-22, Jesus' reply is seventy times seven. Meaning that we should always forgive. The same goes for love, grace, mercy etc. The understanding is that when we are able to develop a pattern of unconditional mercy, forgiveness, love, and grace toward others, we will experience and realize the overwhelming gift of God is deeper and richer than we ever thought.

Explore – Discuss from the following passage how we should develop a life of a mercy and forgiveness.

Matthew 18:23-35

- What accounts do we have to settle? (Financial, relationship, people who have wronged us?)
- How do we handle these accounts? (do we get defensive, argumentative, or merciful?)
- What can we do to prepare ourselves for the next account that must be settled?

Apply – How can you apply what you just studied and learned? What sticks out in your mind about what it means to be loving, merciful, and forgiving?

- What needs to change or be cultivated in your individual life?
- What steps could you take to allow this application to take place?
- What Bible verse could help you stick with your plan?

Prayer – Ask your group to pray for you to take steps to be merciful.
