# Faith, Favoritism, and Love

#### Introduction:

James 2:1-13

### I. The Sin of Partiality

Key Point: Partiality contradicts faith in Christ.

- v.1 Command: "Do not hold the faith... with partiality."
  - o Partiality (favoritism) is incompatible with belief in Jesus, who is impartial.
- vv.2–3 Illustration of favoritism:
  - Rich man vs. poor man in assembly.
  - o Application: How do we treat people based on appearance, wealth, or status?
- v.4 Rebuke: "Have you not become judges with evil thoughts?"

#### II. God's Perspective on the Poor and Rich

Key Point: God often chooses the poor in the world to be rich in faith.

- v.5 God's choice: The poor are often spiritually rich and heirs of the Kingdom.
- vv.6–7 The irony: They dishonor the poor while the rich often oppress and blaspheme.

## III. The Royal Law and the Whole Law

Key Point: Loving your neighbor fulfills the royal law. Breaking one part of the law breaks all of it.

- v.8 "Love your neighbor as yourself" = Royal Law (from Lev. 19:18; affirmed by Jesus).
- v.9 Favoritism is sin.
- vv.10-11 The unity of the law: breaking one command makes you guilty of all.

## IV. Verses 12–13: Speak and Act as One Judged by the Law of Freedom

Key Point: Mercy triumphs over judgment.

- v.12 Live aware that you'll be judged by the "law of liberty" (i.e., gospel law).
- v.13 Without mercy, there is judgment. But mercy triumphs!

## **Prayer Points**

- Ask God to reveal and root out favoritism in your heart.
- Pray for a deeper understanding of mercy and how to extend it.
- Pray for the church to reflect God's impartial love in community.
